Instructions for Application for Admission K – Grade 5

2011 – 2012

- » Please read instructions carefully.
- » Disabled applicants or parents needing assistance, please contact the Admission Office directly.

Applications

Kindergarten and grade 4 are entry levels at Punahou. For grades 1 – 3 and 5, testing for admission is offered only to applicants who are in the wait pool (those who qualified for the previous year, but were not placed.)

Application may be made online at www.punahou.edu/Admission or by completing the admission application available from the Admission Office.

Application Fees

A non-refundable fee of \$100 must accompany each application for admission. For online applications, the non-refundable fee may be charged to a credit card. Payment may also be made by check and submitted with required documentation. For late applicants, the late application fee will be \$125 and may only be paid by check.

Due Dates

Applications for admission with application fees must be received by the Admission Office according to the following deadlines:

Kindergarten	October 15
Grades 1 – 3	December 31 (<i>not available online</i>)
Grade 4	October 31
Grade 5	December 31 (<i>not available online</i>)

Age Requirements at the Time of Entry

To qualify for admission testing, your child must have been born between the dates listed below:

Testing

The Punahou faculty assists in the testing and observation of all K – 5 applicants.

Kindergarten

An individual test session with an assessment specialist is scheduled during the school week between October and March. In addition, each child is required to attend a Saturday morning classroom session.

Grade 4

All applicants whose applications are received or postmarked by October 31 will be scheduled for testing. Achievement tests in reading and math are administered on two Saturdays at Punahou. Testing is scheduled in January and February.

Grades 1, 2, 3 and 5

Achievement testing in math and reading is offered to previously qualified candidates who were not enrolled due to limited space.

Report Cards/Progress Reports

Parents are responsible for submitting clear copies of report cards or progress reports complete with teacher comments by February 15.

** Please note: Punahou School reserves the right to require additional documentation for students with learning differences. Conferences for planning purposes are encouraged.*

Kindergarten

A report card or progress report from last year and the first semester of the current year must be submitted. If your child's school does not have written reports, please write "No report card" under the name of the school on the application form.

Grades 1 – 5

Last year's complete report card, including teacher comments for all reporting periods, and the first semester report card, including comments for the current year, are required.

Teacher Reference Forms

Submit all forms by February 15, but no earlier than January 15.

Kindergarten – Grade 1

One Teacher Reference Report must be submitted to Punahou School by your child's current teacher. Completed forms should be sent directly by the teacher to the Admission Office. If your child has more than one teacher for major subjects, additional forms may be copied or downloaded from www.punahou.edu/Admission. Please provide each teacher with a stamped envelope addressed to the Director of Admission, Punahou School, 1601 Punahou Street, Honolulu, HI 96822.

Grades 2 – 5

One Teacher Reference Report must be submitted to Punahou School by your child's current teacher. Completed forms should be sent directly by the teacher to the Admission Office. If your child has more than one teacher for major subjects, additional forms may be copied or downloaded from www.punahou.edu/Admission. Please provide each teacher with a stamped envelope addressed to the Director of Admission, Punahou School, 1601 Punahou Street, Honolulu, HI 96822.

Standardized Test Reports

If the applicant has recently completed a standardized test in reading, language, or math, the results, complete with test name, level, and date, may be submitted. This is optional; it is useful to have this additional data, but it is not a requirement as some students have not been previously tested.

General Information

- » A non-refundable enrollment deposit of \$500 (to be credited toward tuition) is required by May 10 of all applicants offered admission prior to that date. Candidates accepted after May 10 must submit the deposit within ten days of notification or by the date specified in the letter of acceptance.
- » Physical examinations (including immunizations and tuberculin test) are required of all new Punahou students before the first day of school. Annual dental checkups are required of all students in grades K – 8.
- » Chapel attendance is required of all students.
- » Students failing to meet Punahou's academic or citizenship standards may be asked to withdraw at any time.
- » A family's financial status is not part of admission criteria; the Financial Aid Committee grants aid on the basis of demonstrated financial need. If financial aid is being requested, please indicate in the space provided on the application.

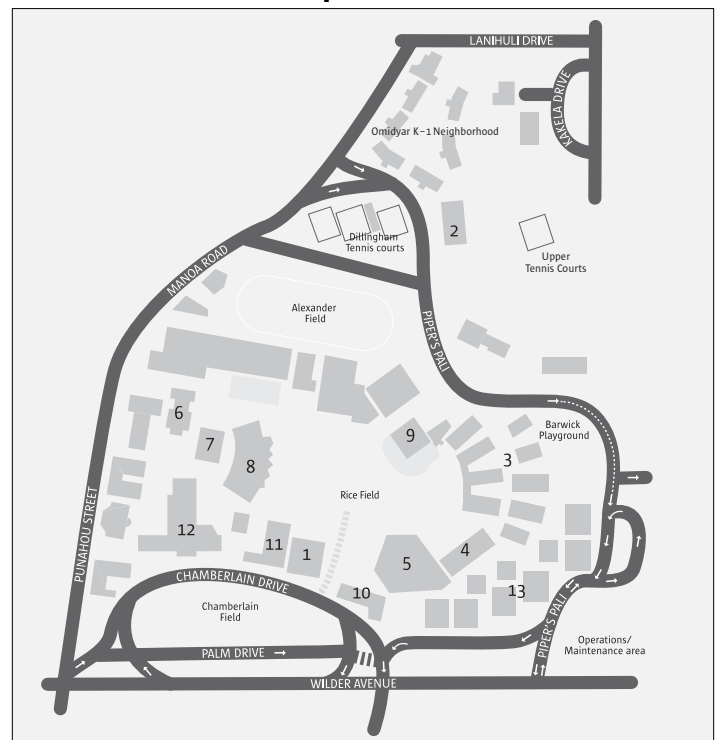

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Checklist for Applicants

Kindergarten

Step 1: The Application

Submit all application materials in a single envelope.

- Completed, signed 2011 – 2012 **Application for Admission** form
- Applicant's photo (*optional, but highly recommended*)
- Application fee of \$100. Submit payment online with a credit card or make check payable to Punahou School.
- Copy of birth certificate
- Copy of previous school year's complete report card or progress report

Step 2: Admission Testing

You will receive an appointment notice for individual and group testing sessions. Be sure to mark your calendar.

Testing dates:

Step 3: Current Teacher Reference

After the first of the year, a current teacher must submit a **Teacher Reference Report** form. Follow these steps:

- Sign the form.
- Affix a Punahou applicant ID label to form.
- Stamp and address an envelope to the Admission Office.
- Deliver form and envelope to appropriate teacher in December.

Step 4: Most Recent Progress Report

- Send a copy of the most recent report card or progress report and teacher comments to the Admission Office. If your child's school does not have written reports, write "no report card" under the name of school on the application form.
